7. Curriculum Update

Review pupil progress -data

The Headteacher provided an update on the Curriculum and highlighted that this was the first data available since Autumn 2019. All classes at the school except Years 2 and 6 had undertaken assessments in Reading, Writing, Maths following their return to school in March 2021 and the results were as follows:

Reading will be listed as a school improvement priority.

The school has invested in a new literacy scheme to close the gap.

The National math tutoring will be used to close the gap in attainment

Year 6

- Combined RWM at 35%
- 12 pupils in Year 6 are on the SEN register
- This cohort has missed one year of teaching and learning
- The impact of Covid on pupil's expected attainment has been significant.

Year 2

- Combined RWM at 60%
- This cohort are expected to progress and achieve expected attainment levels in future years

Year 5

- Combined RWM attainment at 45% and in year 2021/22 are expected to achieve 80%
- Reading 72%; Writing 59%; Maths 50%
- Six pupils are receiving additional maths tutoring and a further six pupils will recieve tutoring

The Maths tutoring and literacy scheme are expected to help pupils in improving their levels of attainment
